25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B – 22nd September 2024

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ

Today's Gospel reading from the book of Mark 9:30-37 reminds us of the profound teachings of Jesus on humility and service.

In this passage, Jesus gathers his disciples and tells them, "The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death he will rise." However, the disciples did not understand this teaching and were afraid to ask Jesus about it.

Reflecting on this, we can see the disciples were focused on their own concerns and ambitions, rather than trying to grasp the deeper meaning of Jesus' words. They were preoccupied with their own expectations of power and glory, rather than embracing the humility and selflessness that Jesus was trying to teach them.

Jesus then goes on to ask his disciples, "What were you arguing about on the way?" The disciples were embarrassed because they had been arguing about who was the greatest among them. Jesus responds by saying, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."

This powerful message from Jesus challenges us to examine our own attitudes and actions. Are we more focused on seeking recognition and status in the eyes of others, or are we willing to humble ourselves and serve those around us with love and compassion?

Jesus then takes a child and places them in the midst of the disciples, saying, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the one who sent me."

By using a child as an example, Jesus is emphasizing the importance of humility, innocence, and simplicity in our approach to faith. Children are not concerned with power or status; they approach others with openness and trust, qualities that we often lose as we grow older.

So, what does this mean for us today? It means that we are called to set aside our pride and ego, and instead embrace the humility and servant-heartedness that Jesus exemplified throughout his life. We are called to serve others with love, to treat each person we encounter with dignity and respect, and to approach our faith with the innocence and trust of a child.

Let us remember that true greatness lies not in seeking recognition or power, but in humble service to others. As we go forth from this place, may we strive to follow the example of Jesus in our daily lives, seeking to serve one another with love and compassion. Amen. Fr Jose P CMI, Parish Priest
